The Silicon Valley Symphony is proud to bring together the musical marriage of young prodigy violinist, Stephen Waarts playing on the world famous 1732 "Ferni" Guarneri del Gesu violin accompanied by the Silicon Valley Symphony conducted by Michael Paul Gibson.

There are two performances of our "FALL for Brahms - again" Concert – first in Menlo Park at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church on Saturday, November 19, 2011, at 7:30 PM. AND in Palo Alto at Saint Mark's Episcopal Church, on Sunday afternoon, November 20, 2011, at 4:00 PM. Ticket donation is \$20 general and \$15 seniors and students; children age 12 and younger are FREE with an adult.

This will be another historic concert! The Silicon Valley Symphony features now 15-year-old violin prodigy, Stephen Waarts in his 4<sup>th</sup> annual appearance with the symphony. Maestro Gibson first collaborated with Stephen, when he was only 12 years old, performing the Tchaikovsky *Violin Concerto* on November 15, 2008. The second performance, at age 13, was the Brahms *Violin Concerto* on March 12 & 13, 2010. And his third, at age 14, the Mendelssohn *Violin Concerto* on June 3 & 4, 2011. These performances are available on YouTube. In this concert, Stephen is returning from Philadelphia on Thanksgiving holiday during fall quarter at the Curtis Institute of Music, studying violin with the famous Aaron Rosand (a Guarneri expert), to play the "Ferni" Guarneri del Gesu violin – a powerful and amazingly smooth instrument. You can hear audio clips – GASP (Great Audio Sneak Preview) on our website of him playing the 1732 "Ferni" Guarneri del Gesu during our 1<sup>st</sup> rehearsal of the *Violin Concerto No. 3 in B minor, Op. 60* written by Camille Saint-Saëns in 1880. The orchestra opens with the rousing "Academic Festival Overture" by Brahms, written during the summer of 1880 as a musical "thank you" to the University of Breslau, which had awarded him an honorary doctorate the previous year. Next young genius violinist Stephen plays Saint-Saëns on the old genius Guarneri violin. Finally we proudly present Symphony No. 4 in Eminor by Johannes Brahms – the composition that reminds us all – again - how much we love Brahms!

Don't miss this one! Stephen Waarts continues to delight audiences and this time playing the world famous "Ferni" del Gesu violin. We look forward to working with Stephen once again and are proud to be a part of his amazing accomplishments and stellar performances. The acoustics in both churches are stunning and enhance your performance experience. We hope you can attend. This concert is a bargain for the price of admission. Get your tickets early and arrive early for the best seats (not reserved).
